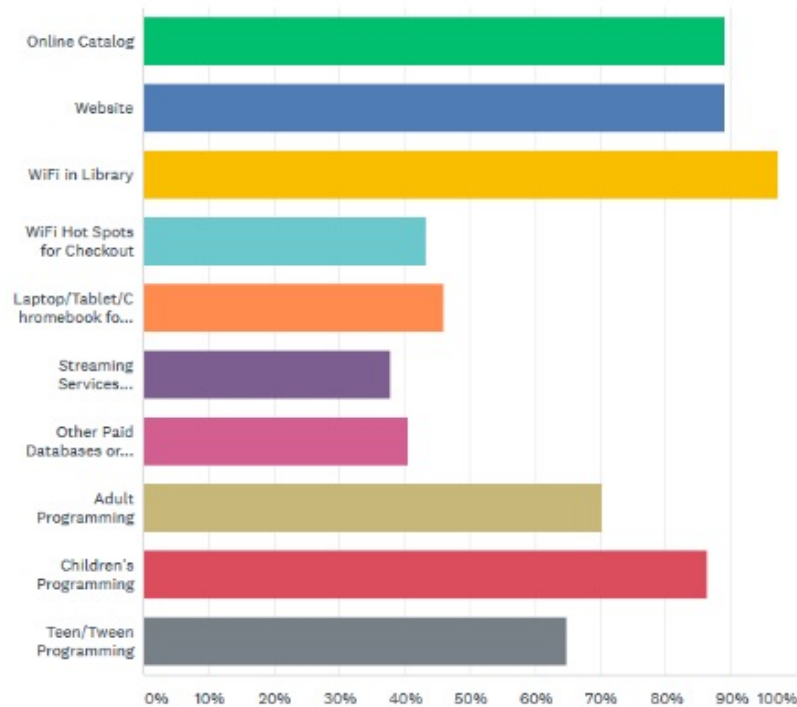

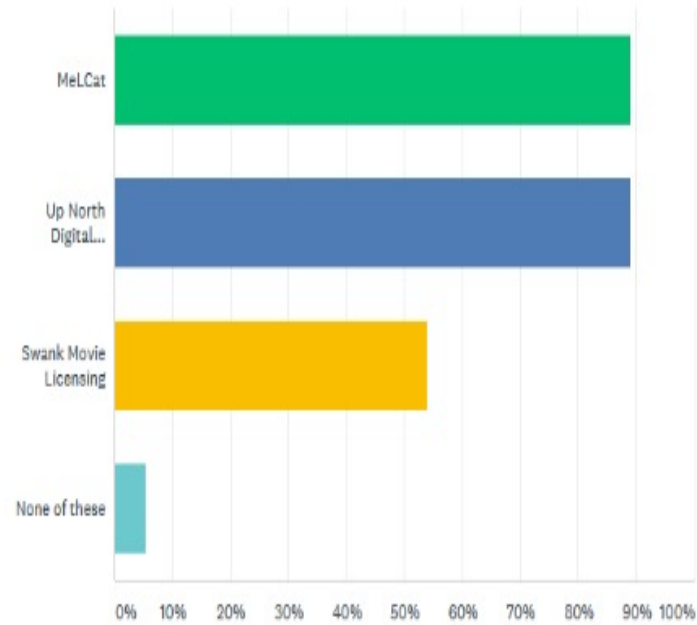
- Biblionix Apollo We use Ploud. We have ipads. 6/7/2021 3:35 PM

There will be an individual equipment grant program, but the minimum will be \$25,000 so it is intended for large ticket items that can be procured quickly (lockers, kiosks, bookmobiles, etc.) - for digital inclusion and for the safe provision of services. The other part of the program will involve statewide grants run by collaborative partners (MLA, MCLS, MCDA - co-ops), one of which will provide equipment.
