Mid-Michigan Library League Director's Report

August 2018

Administrative:

- Final State Aid payments should now have been received by member libraries. We are sending out invoices for the cooperative aid portion, and appreciate payment before mid-September.
- Word back from state librarian Randy Riley regarding a special non-competitive LSTA grant
 to complete public library automation in Michigan was that the Department of Education
 (under which the Library of Michigan falls) does not allow non-competitive grants. We are
 still waiting to hear whether or not they could make a category of the competitive grants that
 is specifically for automation of the remaining un-automated libraries in the state.
- Look for a survey to be sent out to all member libraries asking about the amount of penal
 fines you received this year. I have it almost ready to go. There is a Penal Fine Committee
 looking at whether libraries are getting the correct portion of these funds on a consistent
 basis according to the law.
- The Personnel Committee chair sent me a compiled report of the director evaluation. I am
 very appreciative of the overwhelmingly positive comments! Overall, it appears we are on
 track and moving forward quite well as a cooperative. I welcome feedback at any time
 during the year.

Continuing Education:

- The E-resources Committee is looking at resources to add for the entire service population
 of the cooperative. There will be an increase in State Aid and some cost savings that will
 allow us to provide more E-resources for everyone (without the need to charge back). We
 will continue the RBdigital downloadable audiobooks and access to Transparent Language
 Online. Training, marketing resources, how to get statistics are all posted on the MMLL
