- A Language learning resource with over 100 different languages to choose from, Transparent Language Online


 Four hours of paid tech support for each member library provided by the <u>Emergency Geek</u>, Cory Walker. Mileage to be covered by the cooperative.










Frances H. Pletz Award for Excellence in Service to Youth The deadline to submit a nomination is January 31, 2018.
