



Why school librarians matter: What years of research tell us, By Keith Curry Lance and Debra E. Kachel


FACT: Only **8%** of Michigan Schools employ a full-time certified school librarian and only **18%** employ either a full or part-time school librarian.

FACT: Michigan ranks 47th in the nation in terms of the ratio of students to school librarians and ranks 46th in the nation in 4th-grade students scoring proficient or above in reading as measured by the National Assessment for Educational Progress (NAEP).



Adulting 101

When Teresa Lucas decided to teach basic life skills to young adults via an "Adulting 101" library program series last year, she was not expecting a media



onslaught. But that's what she got. "We had tens of thousands of Facebook hits, of calls, of emails. It was crazy," said Lucas, assistant director of library services at North Bend (Oreg.) Public Library. North Bend is just one of many libraries that have launched classes for young adults on how to balance a checkbook, cook a meal, sew on a button, or shop for auto insurance....

Final Evaluation Findings

As part of the three-year grant from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, PLA hired ORS Impact to conduct ongoing evaluations of Project Outcome. These evaluations helped PLA identify user needs and make strategic and impactful improvements to the project. The final evaluation included an online participant survey and interviews with state library agencies and public libraries using outcome data.

Evidence collected throughout the project's three-year span suggests that Project Outcome has played a significant role in making outcome measurement "business as usual" for libraries and orienting libraries' planning, decision making, and accountability more toward patron and community impact. 


