

The 2017 Arts & Humanities Touring Grant application

Performances/presentations can occur beginning on December 1, 2016 through August 30, 2017. Events outside these dates are not eligible for a Touring Grant. To be eligible for a grant, your application must be received at least four weeks before the date of the performance/presentation. (Exception: Events occurring December 1 through December 15, 2016 must be received three weeks before the date of the performance/presentation.)

Arts & Humanities Touring Grants are processed in the order received until the grant funding is expended. We encourage your organization to apply early.
