

FOCUS on Learning Express Library:

SAT® and ACT® Test Prep

Twenty-five (25) new resources were added for 2016 SAT® test preparation, including complete, full-length practice tests in a test-simulation mode that helps students become confident with the format, timing, and content of the official exam. Complete practice tests and two (2) writing practice tests were also added for the ACT® test.

New eBooks

The eBook collection includes new eBooks for GED® test prep, time management,

communication skills, and Praxis II test prep, plus new editions of Nursing School Entrance Exams, Nursing Assistant/Nurse Aide Exam, Praxis: Core Academic Skills for Educators (5712, 5722, 5732), ASVAB Core Review, and Border Patrol Exam.

New School Center Resources

High School Math Skills Improvement has grown, with five (5) new practice tests aligned to the Common Core State Standards.

CLEP® Test Practice

Two (2) practice tests for the CLEP® College Mathematics exam have been updated to match the latest CLEP® test specifications.

New Career Center Practice Tests

Test prep for military exams increased with the addition of practice tests for the SIFT, ASTB-E: OAR, and ASTB-E: Aviation and Nautical Information tests.

"Giving a Voice to Literature," TEI

Landmark Audio grant program will award (25) \$1,000 grants to support literacy for young people. All libraries are invited to participate whether or not they are current customers. Grant awards will be announced on December 15, 2016. Applicants must be a public or nonprofit community based organization (ex: library or school). Individual library branches within a larger system are welcome to apply. Funds must be used for children's programming and literacy. Simple one-page grant application

LSTA Grant Program for 2017

The LSTA grant program is designed to provide Michigan libraries with the opportunity to develop innovative programs or services that have the potential to develop into sustainable regional or statewide programs, and include strong partnerships between libraries, and/or community groups or agencies. In a given fiscal year, the Library of Michigan will fund ONE to THREE pilot projects that meet these priorities. Priorities:

- Provide funding for innovative library services and programs,
- Create the opportunity to develop sustainable new regional or statewide programs, and
- Develop partnerships among libraries and/or between libraries and community agencies.

Timeline:

- Intent to File Form Due Date October 31, 2016
- Application Due Date January 31, 2017
- Grants Awarded March of application year
- Grant Completion April of final year of grant


Application webinar:




