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They ADD VALUE to the COMMUNITY

- Local businesses and non-profit organizations find resources and possible collaborations via the library
- Property values are higher in areas with public libraries
- 94% of Americans say that "having a public library improves the quality of life in a community." (Pew 2013)

They provide ACCESS to GOVERNMENT

- So much government information is now "born digital," making public libraries essential for access
- Government support, programs, grants, knowledge, job resources - all accessed via your public library
- Public libraries support an informed citizenry

They are places of COMMUNITY CONNECTION
The public library is often where people new to the community come to learn about local resources

- Programs, lectures, craft events, cultural sharing, etc.
 bring people together and celebrate diversity
- Maker spaces, content creation, hands-on learning

They are VIRTUAL as well as PHYSICAL

- As evidenced during Covid, libraries are ONLINE and provide virtual resources and programming
- Library websites connect people with both virtual and inperson resources, accommodating any needs for access to achieve equitable service

Synchronous and asynchronous; Face2Face optional

They support LIFELONG LEARNING

- Public libraries provide a launchpad for anyone seeking information and desiring to learn
- Libraries SHARE (inter-library loan) to benefit those who want resources not locally available
- •Homework help for ALL AGES!

They have PUBLIC ACCESS COMPUTERS
The Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation funded public access computers for libraries during the 90s




